





Grants are available to investigators and/or research teams affiliated with a public or nonprofit entity, such as a university, college, veterinary hospital or clinic, or other institution.

Access to Veterinary Care (AVC) Program

Sponsors: ASPCA, Maddie's Fund®

Topics of Interest: Research that advances knowledge in support of AVC and developing mechanisms for AVC implementation across the veterinary field.

Details: A minimum of three grants will be awarded, with a maximum individual grant amount of \$50,000.




