Alexandra Horowitz, Barnard College/Author

Alexandra is a canine cognition expert and author who has done research on human-canine play, as well as the ethics of using animals in behavior research. Much of her work explores the dog's *umwelt* (experience) and seeks to understand what it is like to be a dog, as well as exploring the cultural history between humans and canines.

Iván Sandoval-Cervantes, University of Nevada, Las Vegas

Iván is an Assistant Professor of cultural anthropology, seeking to understand how animal rights activists operate in the current context of violence in Mexico. His work includes kinship and care, as well as multispecies ethnography, and it has been published in both English and Spanish.

Michelle Rodrigues, Marquette University

Michelle is an Assistant Professor with an emphasis in biological anthropology. Her work includes human-primate interactions across the primate order, with field sites in South America.

Suzanne Asha Stone, International Wildlife Coexistence Network

Suzanne has been working with wolves in Idaho since the 1996 reintroduction. She is the founder of Wood River Wolf Project, an organization dedicated to developing nonlethal management practices.
