#### Submit an Abstract for ISAZ 2020

Abstract submissions are now open for both standard oral presentations and posters. The call for abstracts will close on **Monday**, **February 3**, **2020** at 9:00am UK time.

Submissions regarding any aspect of anthrozoology will be considered.

### Submit a 'Hot Topic' for ISAZ 2020

Submissions are also open for ideas for an Anthrozoology 'Hot topics' discussion. These will take the format of two panelists and a chair, to give a 'for' and 'against' argument over a hot topic for debate in anthrozoology, and then open up to the audience for discussion. Chosen 'hot topics' will be given a 20-30 minute presentation within the conference program. Hot Topic submissions will also close on **Monday, February 3, 2020** at 9:00am UK time.
