Save the Date! The 30th International Society for Anthrozoology conference will occur virtually on June 22-24, 2021

The theme for ISAZ 2021 is "The changing nature of human-animal relationships: Theory, research and practice."

Whether we are talking about wildlife, farm animals, captively housed wild animals, or companion animals, humans' attitudes toward, and relationships with, animals are constantly evolving. The conference will feature live symposia that the current state of research on human-animal relationships and the ways they have changed over time,

which will be complemented by pre-recorded talks that address the theme and the broader field of anthrozoology.

  - -Chair a complete symposium on a topic of your choice


