

ISAZ 2022 Conference News

Hello again from the Conference Hosts and Planning Committee!

It has been a whirlwind since the last newsletter, and we have plenty of news to share regarding ISAZ 2022 in July.



First, the "bad" news.

After careful consideration, and in conjunction with the ISAZ President and Board of Directors, we made the incredibly difficult decision to **move our 2022 conference to a completely online format.** The dates of the conference remain the same (July 7-9, 2022), so if you already blocked out the dates, you are set!

We came to this decision based upon the following factors:

- Feedback from our recent attendance survey showed less than 50% of respondents planned to attend the conference in person.
- Despite rising vaccine rates and decreasing infection rates in the United States, costs of travel and continued concerns over the pandemic are clearly impacting attendance plans.

We appreciate that this is disappointing news for some, but we were prepared for this possibility. We have already begun working with Oxford Abstracts and Creature Conferences (the same services as 2021) to provide an engaging conference experience. We are also taking feedback from last year's conference to heart and are making every effort to further simplify the process and interactivity of attendance.

We want to assure all ISAZ members, attendees, and partner organizations that we still have an excellent conference planned, with **plenty of opportunities to interact in real time.** We are talking unstructured Zoom networking opportunities throughout the day, livestream chat, and a fun conference scavenger hunt.
