Dr. Sandra McCune, VN, BA (Mod), PhD

Visiting Professor in Human-Animal Interaction University of Lincoln, UK

Dr. McCune's talk will draw on her international experience of leading research programs to provide a synthesis of the history and future of human-animal interaction research. She will also consider the challenges of translating human-animal interaction research evidence into policy and practice to support animals and people.

ISAZ 2023 Distinguished Anthrozoologist Award Winner



The ISAZ board of directors is delighted to announce **Professor Harold Herzog**, **PhD**, as the recipient of the ISAZ 2023 Distinguished Anthrozoologist Award. Widely recognized as one of the cofounders of the field, he has enjoyed an impressive academic career at Western Carolina University, where he has been Professor Emeritus since 2016. Dr. Herzog has been the recipient of many competitive awards and has authored over 100 publications in a wide variety of outlets due to research that has followed an extraordinarily eclectic and thought-provoking trajectory, exploring topics as

diverse as attitudes toward cockfighting, the psychology of animal rights activism, and the ethical paradoxes attending the exploitation of animals. He is known for comfortably and eloquently tackling difficult and controversial issues with the highest degree of scientific and scholarly rigor. Although formally retired, he is as active as ever, working as a "cheerleader for anthrozoology" via various activities, such as writing a book for the general public (Some We Love, Some We Hate, Some We Eat: Why It's So Hard to Think Straight About Animals), writing articles for his widely read Psychology Today blog (Animals and Us), and contributing to journalist interviews, radio shows, and podcasts.

Although he will regrettably not be able to join us in-person at ISAZ 2023, the board plans to recognize Dr. Herzog during the Award Presentation to be held at Edinburgh University in Edinburgh, Scotland, on June 17, 2023. We are excited to announce that Dr. Herzog plans to deliver the Distinguished Anthrozoologist Plenary in person at ISAZ 2024, location TBA.


