What does this mean for authors? When papers are accepted for publication, they can now be more quickly copy-edited, typeset, and published online. This will allow us to more efficiently share new and exciting peer-reviewed research in the field of anthrozoology.

What does this mean for readers? Once enough papers are online, they will be bundled into an issue of the journal and printed according to our usual annual schedule: February, April, June, August, October, December. Watch out for the hard copy of the journal this year, as it will be sporting our new cover design.

Meet the Anthrozoologist - Dr. Kristen Jacobson
